### Experience

Mr. Yeung represents public and private sector employers in all areas of labor and employment law. In addition to employment litigation, Mr. Yeung handles labor arbitrations and hearings before Civil Service Commissions and Personnel Boards. He also has extensive experience litigating unfair practice charges before the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB).
